


HEIRARCHY OF SAFEGUARDS



MOST Effective	Safeguarding Controls
Total Elimination or Control of Hazards	Eliminate all Heat Sources, Zero Tolerance for Smoking
Built in Fire Protection	Maximum Use of Proactive Fire Protection
Awareness and Accountability	Company Policy and Personal Commitment
Training and Procedures	Standard Work Procedures: Prefire planning, on the job training, effective security measures are all proactive.
Specific Code Provisions	Chapter 14: There are 17 sections in Chapter 14 that deal with precautions against fire. The following code provisions have various levels of effectiveness in preventing and controlling fires; Hot Work Control Measures Smoking - Zero Tolerance Waste Disposal - Fuel Reduction Security and Fire Watch - Observation of Conditions Control of Materials - Flammable and Combustible Fire Extinguishers
LEAST Effective	Access to the building Means of egress Water supply for fire protection
